University Executive Directive (UED) 85-08, "Skateboards and Roller Skates," was established in March 1985 in the interest of pedestrian safety. At the time of the creation of the Executive Directive, it established restrictions on the use of bicycles, mopeds, skateboards, and roller skates within the interior pathways of campus.

With the increasing popularity of "hoverboards," in Spring 2016, we updated UED 85-08 to include restrictions on the use of "hoverboards" on campus pathways. Additional considerations and recommendations were made for the Housing license agreement and the Community Living Standards to ban the use and/or storage of "hoverboards" within the residential community.

I. Purpose

Riding of Bicycles, Scooters, Skateboards, and Other Wheeled Vehicles

All walkways, inner campus pathways, and plaza areas are reserved exclusively for pedestrian traffic. Skateboarders must dismount, and bicycles and scooters must be walked and secured to designated bike racks outside of restricted pathways.

Mobility aids are exempt from this policy.

II. Authority

Pursuant to the authority and responsibilities assigned to this office under Section 21113 of the California Vehicle Code, Sections 89031-89035 of the California Education Code, and Section 42200 of Title 5, California Administrative Code, the bicycle and moped regulations are hereby amended to include the following:

III. Policy Statement

Rules and Regulations

- The riding of bicycles, scooters, skateboards, and other wheeled vehicles is only permitted on designated paths on campus.
- Bicycles, scooters, skateboards, and other wheeled vehicles may not be parked or secured to landscaping, stairways, railings, or any other unauthorized areas.
- All bicycles, scooters, skateboards, and other wheeled vehicles must be operated at a safe speed, and wheels must remain in contact with the ground at all times.
- Recreational use of bicycles, scooters, skateboards, and other wheeled vehicles is prohibited on campus grounds.



• Reckless riding, including but not limited to stunt or trick riding, excessive speed, or any action that endangers the safety of individuals or property, is strictly prohibited.

IV. Definitions

- Wheeled Vehicles: Includes bicycles, unicycles, scooters, skateboards, and similar devices without motors.
- Motorized Wheeled Vehicles: Devices powered partially or entirely by motors.
- Mobility Aids: Medically necessary devices such as wheelchairs, power scooters, and walkers.
